In 2008, Mike announced he was going to New Orleans for two months to build a hurricane- and flood-resistant sustainable home for a victim of Hurricane Katrina. He was also bringing his own crew down to help with the build.

Sherry decided to strap on her own tool belt and merge both of her world's together, not only jumping in with both feet but also her heart. It was the first time Sherry worked on a jobsite and the first time she worked with family—her dad, Uncle Billy and her brother, Mike Jr.—and she couldn't have chosen a more grueling and demanding project to start.

Between the environment, building conditions, setbacks and time crunches New Orleans was exhausting from start to finish, but it was also exhilarating for Sherry. She was hooked and never looked back. Since then she has been a permanent member of Mike's crew—first on Holmes Inspection and then on Holmes Makes It Right—cultivating her skills as a framing and tiling pro.
