


JOHN OATES
President of Skills/Compétences Canada

John Oates, the President of Skills/Compétences Canada, has had a long history with the Skills Movement in Canada. He has been the President of Skills Canada – Newfoundland and Labrador since 2004, the same year he joined the national Board of Directors. During his time on the Board of Directors of Skills/Compétences Canada, he has served in the positions of Director, Secretary, and Vice-President.

John has long been a strong proponent of promoting careers in the skilled trades and technologies. He recently retired from College of the North Atlantic, where for almost 40 years he was a very vocal advocate for increasing trade and technology training opportunities in his home province, as well as across the country. He leads a team of more than 500 faculty and staff, who teach approximately 15,000 apprenticeship and full-time students per year. With a degree in psychology from the University of Alberta already in hand, Malcolm first came to NAIT in 1991 to train as a sheet metal worker and graduated with his journeyman ticket in 1994. In 1997, he returned as an instructor and taught for over 10 years, becoming the associate chair of the Sheet Metal Worker program. He also held the title of associate dean and interim dean before officially being appointed dean in 2014.
